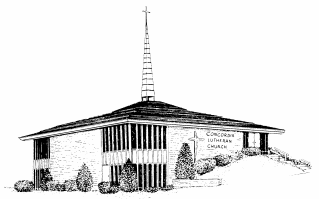

Concordia 50th Anniversary Note

Excerpt from a letter to Rev. August Stenzel, founding pastor from Rev. Leslie Frerking, President of Southeastern District, dated February 25, 1060.
" Dear Brother Stenzel: I'm glad you believe in the motto "keep your District President informed". I don't think that everybody believes in this motto. For evidence I offer the proof—I have heard nothing whatever about the situation in Hagerstown or the possibility of developing a mission in that community. That there is such opportunity is a source of great delight to me. Under the circumstances, I think you can be assured of my unqualified approval and support for the moves which have been made under your direction. I even like the name "Concordia Lutheran Church". You can depend upon it that I will bring this matter before the board in March." (Note: other executives within the district were

involved in discussions about starting a congregation in the Hagerstown-Frederick area.)

Prospects rosy for adult stem-cell treatments by Charlie Butts

The past decade spelled success in research with adult stem cells.

The one area in stem-cell research where there have been no successful treatments is research on human embryos, which involves killing a tiny human being. Dr. David Prentice of the Family Research Council tells OneNewsNow there has been progress in a related field, that of induced pluripotent stem cells that can be developed by taking, for example, skin cells and adding a few genes and reprogramming the cell so it looks and acts like an embryonic stem cell. real success, says Prentice, has been with adult stem cells.

"We've got stem cells in all of these tissues from the moment we're born," he explains. "They're in the umbilical cord blood that we cut off the newborn baby -- and these are the cells that actually can repair and replace damaged tissue."

Research on adult stem cells is already helping thousands of people, treating such things as spinal cord injury, heart damage, stroke, and juvenile diabetes. "And the list keeps growing," Prentice adds.
